We wish to acknowledge once more with gratitude a generous grant from the British Academy towards the publication of this issue of the Proceedings.

The third Jackson Knight memorial lecture on "The Georgics : a Transitional Poem" was delivered at Exeter on 20th March, 1970, by Mr. Colin Hardie of Magdalen College, Oxford. Copies (30 n.p. each, plus 3 n.p. for postage) may be obtained from the Abbey Press, Abingdon-on-Thames, Berkshire. Mr. Hardie sees a continuity of themes in Virgil's work with the Georgics as bridge, or as a "matrix of mythological themes first formed in Eclogue VI, which are built on a framework of agricultural didactic in the Georgics and of Greco-Roman history in the Aeneid."

The 1972 Latin Calendar produced by the Orbilian Society contains reproductions of twelve large engravings based on the illustrations in the Vatican Virgil.
